WHAT DOES THE SCHOOL COUNSELOR DO?

- · Works with individuals and groups
- · Helps identify needs of students
- · Encourages better interpersonal relationships
- · Promotes positive attitudes and choices
- · Aids teachers and parents in helping students
- Assists people in making use of community resources
- Coordinates efforts with other school programs
- Assists students with the process of growing up
- · Coordinates referrals to outside agencies
- · Assists with in-service programs for faculty
- · Participates in curriculum development
- · Provides "preventative" services
- Maintains confidentiality



SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAMS

During the school year many services to support our students are available through our school counselor and academic support teacher.

Group Counseling: counseling groups are available for students in grades K-12. Participation in a group is voluntary and requires parental notification. Topics covered during groups sessions include: social skills, self-esteem, communication skills, problem-solving skills, assertiveness, and maintaining friendships. The children are encouraged to practice each skill throughout the week.

Classroom Lessons: Lessons are provided by the school counselor. They may be taught to a whole grade level, or specific classrooms, based on teacher requests. Past topics have focused on anger management; bullying and harassment; appropriate touch (keeping hands to self); transition to middle school; kindness, and the importance of respect.

My office is always open to students who need to discuss an issue or problem. Students may also meet with the school counselor on an individual basis to address concerns raised by parents and teachers. Please contact me at my e-mail: efox@bfs.or.kr if you have a concern regarding your child.

Early Childhood (EC)

Cooperative Book Buddy Program Mr. Zwingelberg (grade 3), Mrs. Dysart (PreK-3), and Ms. Pauley's (K4) students are participating in a cooperative book buddy program. Activities have included a Halloween art activity and Turkey Bingo. Most of all, our students love to read books together! Students are becoming more familiar with each other and building lovely friendships. We look

forward to sharing more exciting times together in 2015!



Kindergarten 5

During the month of November, Kindergarten-5 learned about Thanksgiving and how it came to be. We began the journey by touring the Mayflower. We discussed how what it was like living on the Mayflower for 66 days. The students created their own Mayflower and wrote how they would feel if they were sailing with the Pilgrims. We continued our unit by mapping the journey that the Mayflower took from the United Kingdom to Cape Cod, Massachusetts. The students then explored the homes that the Pilgrims built during their first winter in Plymouth. They created their own Pilgrim houses using Popsicle sticks to represent the materials that the Pilgrims used in building their homes. We continued the unit by exploring how the Wampanoag Native Americans helped the Pilgrims survive their second winter in Plymouth. The students created Indian corn representing how the Native Americans taught the Pilgrims how to plant corn, gather food and hunt in New England. We completed our unit by comparing the foods that the Pilgrims and Native Americans enjoyed on the first Thanksgiving to the food that Americans now enjoy on Thanksgiving. The two weeks were filled with projects, questions, great conversations and delicious apple pie!







Elementary

1st Grade Field Trip On Friday, November 7th, the 1st grade class boarded the bus on a field trip to the Busan Tower. The field trip was a celebration of the end of a Social Studies. The unit focused on communities, rules, and laws. To prepare for the field trip, the first graders did some amazing city planning to decide which buildings would be needed in a city. Then, they constructed each building and plotted out where each would be located in relation to other buildings and streets. After creating a map of the city and voting on the name Mustache Land, we decided to compare our city to a real city... and the best way to observe a real city is to go to Busan Tower! We peered out the windows over the beautiful city of Busan and compared it to the city we created. It was a fun and exciting way to wrap up an interesting unit.

Robotics Class Check out what the robotics class has ben up to lately...



PTSO Update


Happy New Year and welcome back to BFS!
