# FUN DAY

During this constricted time of COVID-19, the HS STUCO created an event that would bring joy to our hearts and light up our day: HS Fun Day. On this day, the different grade levels of HS competed against each other through many fun games and activities. The games and activities were organized into a schedule like a school day so that students could easily follow along. Each game gave points to the team that won it, and the final goal for the teams was to get the most points. Although this event did have a competitive side, the most remarkable aspect was that the grade levels were able to cooperate and have fun. HS Fun Day was truly amazing!







The first order of the day was the 'Team-Building Game.' During this time, each grade level had to come up with a poster and chant for their team. For the poster, the students were given various materials to create an attractive poster. After a team completed their poster, they moved on to the chant. The chant was a way of advocating the team. When making it, each team had to be creative and include every member. In the end, the chants produced by the different teams were all unique in their own way and really reflected upon the team's grade level. The Team Building Game was a really fun activity to start the Fun Day with as it involved a lot of cooperation and discussion amongst the students.

The next game that took place was the 'Running Man Relay.' During this game, there were many small activities that each team had to complete. The different activities were arranged in a straight row in the BFS gym. These activities included:

- Elephant nose and ball throw
- Blanket ball
- Group jump rope
- Race on square board with a hula hoop
- 3-legged race
- Telepathy game
- Transport ball
- Chopstick game
- Speed game
- Frozen T-shirt



The challenge of this game was that only a set number of students from each grade could participate in an activity. This meant that certain students participating in an activity needed to cooperate well with their teammates. The final goal of this game was to see which team could complete all of the activities the quickest.

The 'Trivia' activity was what students played after the relay game. This activity was a large game of Kahoot that required each student to have a device with them. In order to split the large number of students, each grade level was either sent to the auditorium or the cafeteria. The questions themselves were of various topics, ranging from the students of BFS to countries of the world. Although the topic of the questions was very diverse, one thing for sure was that everyone had fun!

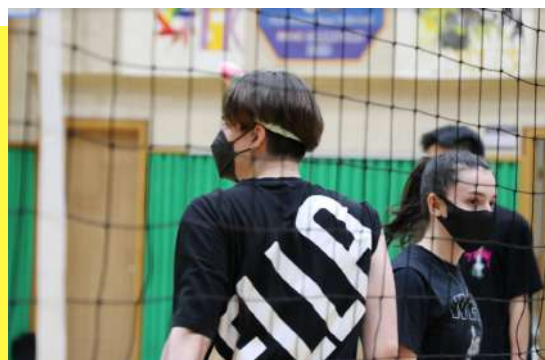
An alternative that was available was the 'Tower Building Game.' During this activity, each team was provided with a stack of paper. Using only this material, each team had to create the tallest tower possible. The heights of the towers would later be measured, and the team with the tallest tower would win. This activity was very amusing as the different teams each approached the task in different ways. Some teams preferred to make a strategic approach by creating many pillars and layers, while other teams favored a more directive approach by creating rolled-up sticks. But in the end, each tower was unique in its own way, and everybody had fun.



Students were offered two options in the subsequent hour. You could either go to Mr. Muller's room for E-Sports or go to the gym for volleyball. In Mr. Muller's room, students competed against one another by grade level on a game called 'Super Smash Bros.' Many students came to participate in this game, as 'Super Smash Bros.' is a game that is very popular amongst BFS students. In the gym, the students participating in volleyball were put into teams by their grade levels. The volleyball games were held against different grade levels, and the teams played each game for multiple rounds until one reached 15 points. Volleyball was also an activity that was popular at BFS, and many students came to either participate or spectate.

After a long period of intense competition, it was finally lunchtime. The policy for lunch was still the same, with the food being provided by the excellent Pulmuone staff. Along with the excellent Pulmuone lunch were also the concession stands, which provided great snacks and beverages. In general, the lunchtime of this Friday was a time for students to relax and recharge themselves in order to prepare for the intense activities that awaited them.

Once everybody had something to eat and was charged up again, it was time for the next activity: the Escape Room. Just like the Trivia game, the students were, once again, split up into different groups. But this time, there were eight different groups. This was because the Trivia game required more focused thinking with fewer people. Once everybody found out their groups, they went to the room they were assigned to, which was either Mr. Neeno's room, Mr. Cassinello's room, Mrs. Muller's room, or Ms. Slovak's room. Each group was given a set of clues to solve a problem, and the goal of the activity was to solve the problem as fast as possible in the given time limit of 40 minutes. The different paper clues were all different from each other, and this really required the students to discuss information and talk together. In the end, some groups had success and solved the problem while others failed to do so.





After the very arduous 'Escape the Room' game, the next activity on the schedule was 'Capture the Flag.' For this activity, everybody gathered back at the gym. In the gym, the students were put into their four original groups determined by grade level. The gym was split up into two, and two grade levels were going to compete at a time. Each side of the court had a jail, a safe zone, and a pile of flags. The goal of this activity was to capture as many flags as possible from the opponent's territory. This activity was a very remarkable activity because it was the first activity to have grade-level teams after the Running Man Relay activity. It also involved a lot of running and physical activity, which brought a smile to everyone's face.

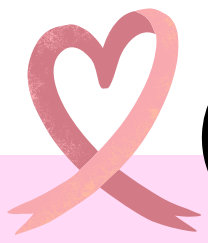


After a tiring but fun day of many games, it was time for the final activity. The final game had three parts: Guess the Password, Kahoot Shape Game, and Dodgeball. 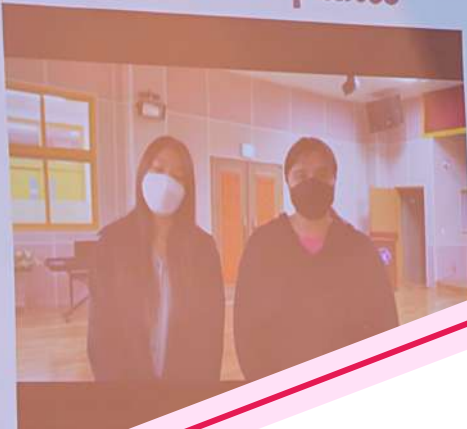

# PLAYER CHEATS IN CHESS TOURNAMENT

On Saturday, May 22nd, our BFS Chess club attended an online chess tournament to showcase their skills and hopefully make the podium. Upon entering the tournament, things had already started to go wrong. The officiator for the High School chess tournament was IP banned from the Chess website they

were using, chess.com, and was unable to admit participants other than those already admitted to the chess hub, which consisted of only BFS students even though students from multiple schools signed up for the high school bracket. This led our BFS students to join the middle school tournament, as there were simply not enough players admitted into the high school tournament to participate.

Of course, our BFS players thought that this would be the end to the difficulties already presented by attempting to join the tournament, yet another obstacle presented itself in the form of a player named ISB\_noahadidas.

ISB\_noahadidas used a chess engine to CHEAT in the chess tournament that consisted of over 4 schools including BFS, ISB, GIFS, DIS, GPA, and ISK. So how do we know that this user was cheating?

Brayden Kloster, the BFS Chess Club founder, noticed something off about this user's gameplay when playing against him. Brayden noticed that in their match, this user held a 97.2% accuracy rate in their chess game, which is already suspicious in itself. Brayden took it upon himself to look further into this issue, and the results were quite shocking.

This user, when matched against two of our BFS players Brayden Kloster and Andrew Lee, had an accuracy percentage of 97.2% and 98.7% respectively. When Brayden looked at this user's chess history, however, he noticed that most of his games held a 60 to 70 percent accuracy rate, a far cry from the rates we see against our two BFS players. After the tournament, the BFS team ran both these games through two chess engines, StockFish and Komodo, and found near-perfect symmetry between the chess games and these chess engines, securing the fact that this user cheated against our players.

Brayden, when asked about how he felt about this cheating 'scandal', replied with "I feel like this kind of thing shouldn't really be happening at all in tournaments such as this. I understand that people cheat to win at higher levels when things are on the line but there is none of that here. Our tournament was just between local schools with no prize; it was for people to come and show their skill in chess and to have a good time. Cheating in something like this just ruins the fun for everyone else involved and shows that the player involved has no skills or confidence to actually play".

# The Korean Memorial Day

This year, June 6th was a Sunday. A lot of people were upset that it overlapped with the weekends because they could have rested for a day if it was on a weekday. People forget to remember, however, the reason why they could have taken a day off if it was on a weekday — June 6th of 2021 marks the 66th anniversary of the Korean Memorial Day. So what is it that makes this day so special?

The Korean Memorial Day or in Korean, “현충일” (Hyun-choong-il), is the day where we remember all of the soldiers who fought for the world we live in now. First started in 1956, the Korean Memorial Day was originally intended to commemorate the passed soldiers from the Korean War only. However, it was soon decided that the day should be dedicated to all soldiers who passed away at one point trying to fight for our country’s peace.

The reason that Memorial Day was chosen to be June 6th is quite interesting. Early June was known to be one of the best times of the year to harvest barley and plant wheat. Therefore, the dates in early June were considered to be auspicious. This is why from the Goryeo Dynasty to the Chosun Dynasty, deceased soldiers and generals were buried on June 6th and then celebrated in the subsequent years. In addition, the Korean War that started on June 25th had one of the most casualties ever caused on Korean soil, which was why the government in 1956 chose June 6th as Memorial Day — they are both in the same month.

# Clarinet

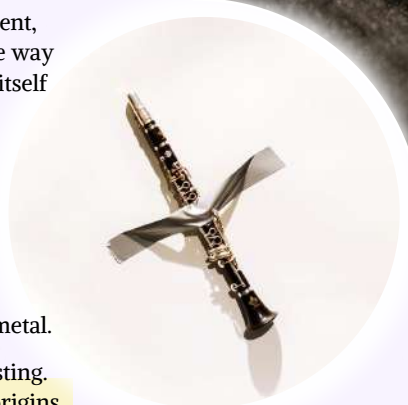

Have you ever wondered what the name of this mysterious stick is? A recorder? A flute? A black saxophone? An oboe? Well, this is actually an instrument called the clarinet. And unlike our expectations of it being rare and unknown, it is actually quite popular, with over 23% of the US population reported playing the clarinet.

The clarinet is a woodwind instrument, meaning that you need to blow in some way or another to create sound. The sound itself is created when vibrations happen on a sharp strip of wood called the reed after the air passes through it. Another prominent feature of the clarinet is its black color. The black material used to make the clarinet is actually a type of African blackwood called Mpingo. The rest of the silver keys are made out of metal.



The history of the clarinet is interesting. The clarinet is believed to have many origins, such as the early hornpipes that were used in Ancient Greece and Ancient Egypt. However, the instrument that was closest to our modern-day clarinet was the Chalumeau, which was invented in the 1680s. The Chalumeau was a recorder-like instrument that used a reed to create sound and consisted of eight tone holes. Although the Chalumeau was an excellent instrument back in the day, it had one problem: air leakage. Early clarinets all used rough materials such as felt to cover the tone holes, and this caused air leakage. Luckily, in 1812, Iwan Müller, a Baltic German inventor, created a new type of pad that used leather. This new type of pad was a success, and new inventors were able to create many variations of the early clarinet with more tone holes and keys.

The final development of the modern clarinet system was done in 1839 by Hyacinthe Klosé. The new system was called the Boehm system and had a different arrangement of keys which allowed for more simple fingering. This Boehm system soon gained popularity from all over the world, and it is the most common type of clarinet used today. Why don't you try the clarinet in the near future?

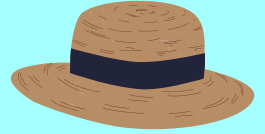
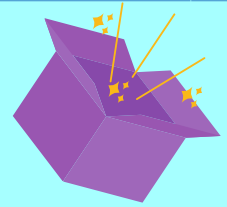
